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Introduction

"Why would I want to preach with my films? To convince people who already agree with me? Plus, I find it quite boring... Art and the cinema must serve to bring people together, to prompt discussion between people who may have conflicting or differing points of view; but if I do preach, in fact I am simply alienating those who don't share that ideology. That's why, if I'm going to bring politics into my film, they must be veiled: they must be subversive, open enough to allow the audience to apply their own ideas". The reflections of Sean Baker, director of Anora, winner of the Golden Palm at Cannes and programmed in Perlak, during his talk at the Tabakalera cinema, mirror the take of the team who organise the San Sebastian Festival and who see the Festival as a sprawling conversation made up of the ideas contained by the films programmed, the discussions of critics and the industry and the talks fostered by Thought & Discussion. This nonstop 9-day conversation enjoyed the participation of more people than in its previous editions: 172,301 spectators (8.9% more than 2023) and 5,314 accredited guests (5.8% more than last year), with an increase in the number of journalists, particularly of international media (up by 27%).

Constituting an open space for discussion and exchange for people with different ideas doesn't mean that there are no principles to defend. In this respect, the Festival, as a platform for the defence of culture, has spoken out at this edition against the dismantling of the Argentine film industry and to defend the freedom of expression of the film *Tardes de soledad / Afternoons of Solitude* directed by Albert Serra, which finally earned recognition on winning the Golden Shell. But it has also hosted important discussions with less media attention, such as the spontaneous testaments to have emerged following screening of the movie by Costa-Gavras, revealing concern when it comes to dealing with the death both of ourselves and of those closest to us in the best possible conditions.

"Being trans is not purely a matter of identity, it is also political: it means believing that the world can be constructed differently. The fact that I work within a system doesn't mean that I support it, and, in fact, I constantly feel assimilationist pressure from Hollywood, which wants queer voices to be attractive and accessible for normative society. This is gentrification and we must stay true to our principles". The conviction expressed by Jane Schoenbrun (I Saw the Glow) during the conversation with the Nest filmmakers as regards the possibility of the world being constructed differently is mirrored, in cinematic terms, in the Festival's backing of the new approaches brought by up and coming talents. This is a long-standing commitment: in 2024 it was 50 years since the first New Filmmakers section was introduced. That pioneering initiative is now rolled out not only in today's New Directors or Nest, but in the programming of first and second films in all sections (54 at the 72nd edition, five of them in the Official Selection) and of initiatives such as Ikusmira Berriak, whose residencies celebrate their tenth anniversary with full consolidation and solid prestige.

The Donostia Award presented by Tilda Swinton to Pedro Almodóvar reminds us that the Spanish moviemaker brought his debut feature (Pepi, Luci, Bom y otras chicas del montón, 1980) to the Festival, precisely to the New Filmmakers section; others to have made their debut in San Sebastian who returned this year after harvesting international success are filmmakers including John Crowley (We Live in Time), Dea Kulumbegashvili (Aprili / April) and Hiroshi Okuyama (Boku no ohisama / My Sunshine). Casting our eyes back is an essential exercise, not only to appreciate the work done, but also to take a new look at today and rethink the future: this year has seen an extension of the Klasikoak section to include the Filmoteca Vasca programme running throughout the year, the retrospective dedicated to Italian detective movies, the self-same Klasikoak section in the framework of the Festival and the Cuban film season of films restored by the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola together with other international institutions, On the Other Island.

The lessons of the past lend us perspective when addressing the latest challenges raised in the talks for the film industry on the influence of artificial intelligence or for the media on the weight of social networks in their coverage and the tendency towards polarisation, which takes us back to Sean Baker's initial reflection. Actor Andrew Garfield, in his talk with the Festival audiences. said that "we can measure the mental and emotional wellbeing of a culture by the way a government values the arts. And I firmly believe that because art, stories, the cinema and the theatre have saved my life time and again". Perhaps the ambition to save lives is a step too far, but the team who organise the Festival will continue to strive by means of selecting, programming and accompanying film crews to ensure that the conversation across the divide on the cinema and today's world and their positive effects on the sense of belonging to a community gain strength year after year.

Report





New Directors

International competition between the first or second feature movies by their directors, as yet unscreened – they can only have been released in their country of production – and produced in the last year.

All of the films in this section compete for the Kutxabank-New Directors Award, coming with 50,000 euros distributed in equal parts between the director and the distributor of the film in Spain.

The Kutxabank-New Directors Award is sponsored by Kutxabank, an official Festival collaborator. The Jury of the Kutxabank-New Directors Award has the task of assessing these films and deciding the award.

Films in the New Directors section are also candidates for the DAMA Youth Award, decided by a jury of students between the ages of 18 and 25 years.





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

Retrospective – Violent Italy. Italian Crime Films

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A total of 22 feature films released between 1943 and 2023 made up the retrospective at the 72nd edition of the San Sebastian Festival which, with the title of *Violent Italy. Italian Crime Films*, gave a complete rundown of the so-called *poliziesco* genre. The season also included the publication of a book on the subject written by the historian Felipe Cabrerizo, coordinator of the retrospective with Quim Casas, a critic and member of the Festival Selection Committee.

Report

Organised in collaboration with the Istituto Italiano di Cultura, the season helped to increase knowledge of a genre rendering an accurate portrait of the country and which is still today pending review from a contemporary perspective.

In 2024 the San Sebastian Festival and the Filmoteca Vasca have promoted a festival of classic movies extended over time and space, grouped into three seasons: the dozen or so restored films programmed in spring by the Filmoteca at several cultural institutions throughout the Basque Autonomous Community, Navarre and the French Basque Country; the six films in the Klasikoak section and the this retrospective. This year, the cycle *On the Other Island*, a selection of restored Cuban films produced between the 1960s and the 1990s.

On the Other Island

The San Sebastian Festival's 72nd edition hosted, as part of its Klasikoak programme, the season entitled *On the Other Island*, a selection of 18 restored Cuban films dating from the 1960s to the 1990s. The proposal of the Festival, of the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola (EQZE), which has actively participated in the restoration, and of the Basque Film Archive, was split into five showings, bringing largely unseen works by filmmakers including Sara Gómez and Nicolás Guillén Landrián, approved figures such as Santiago Álvarez and amateur creators operating outside the institutional structures.

The films — in many cases programmed as world premieres or showing for the first time in Spain— are digital restorations resulting from the collaboration between Cuban bodies (Cinemateca de Cuba, ICAIC, filmmakers and private individuals) and international institutions such as the self-same Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola, through its Film Restoration and Preservation Department, Vulnerable Media Lab / Queen's University (Canada), Arsenal-Institut für Film und Videokunst (Germany), Altahabana Films (Madrid), the Archivistas Salvajes collective (Cuba-San Sebastian) and the Institut National de l'Audiovisuel (France).

¿Es el enemigo? La película de Gila / May I Speak With the Enemy?, which had its premiere on September 26 in the Victoria Eugenia Theatre, directed by Alexis Morante and starring Óscar Lasarte, Carlos Cuevas, Natalia de Molina and Salva Reina, is an uplifting fable based on the period when Miguel Gila fought in the war and survived execution by firing squad. An anti-war argument narrating the tragic events he experienced first-hand during the fighting and how he lent them his own comical slant.

The latest movie from Rodrigo Cortés, Escape, with Mario Casas in the leading role and Martin Scorsese as executive producer, had its gala in the Kursaal 2 on September 27. This is the story of N., a broken man who's done with making decisions; he only wants to live in prison and will do whatever it takes to get there. A highly personal movie, impossible to classify, with Anna Castillo, José Sacristán, José María Pou, Blanca Portillo, Guillermo Toledo and Juanjo Puigcorbé, among others, in the cast alongside Mario Casas.

Las chicas de la estación / The Girls at the Station, by Juana Macías, was shown at the Príncipe Cinemas on September 23, and is inspired by true events at a juvenile facility in Mallorca, where several of the girls fall into a prostitution ring. The film draws a generational portrait of a sector of young people close to crossing the line of no return.

FIPRESCI Grand Prix

Poor Things, directed by Yorgos Lanthimos, obtained the FIPRESCI Grand Prix after having been chosen film of the year 2024 by the members of FIPRESCI, the International Federation of Film Critics. The vote had the participation of 791 film critics all over the world, who have chosen this British production from among all of the films premiered after 1 July 2023.

The other four finalists were Nu astepta prea mult de la sfârsitul lumii / Do not Expect Too Much from The End of the World, by Radu Jude, Aku Wa Sonzai Shinai / Evil Does Not Exist by Ryusuke Hamaguchi (Perlak, 2023), All of Us Strangers, by Andrew Haigh and The Seed of the Sacred Fig, by Mohamad Rasoulof (Perlak, 2024).

The Industry Department has offered, once again this year, a complete agenda of its own activities and also in collaboration with other entities and organizations of the audiovisual sector. Several of the proposed contents have been included in the Industria section of the website.

The number of accredited holders has grown again with respect to 2023 (2,216) and this year has reached the figure of **2,392 professionals**, 37 of which were accredited online.

During the **Co-Production Forum** held on September 23, 24 and 25 at the San Telmo Museum, the projects selected in this activity and in Ikusmira Berriak had an intense agenda of **554 appointments** with industry professionals.

The **WIP Latam** and **WIP Europa** initiatives, also held September 23-25, presented six Latin American and four European productions, respectively, to an audience of professionals from the fields of production, distribution, sales and festival programming. After their theatrical screening, these films were available in the film library until the Festival's end.

For the third consecutive year, the Festival has organized **Spanish Screenings: Financing & Tech**, which has

hosted, on the one hand, the third **Creative Investors' Conference** (September 24 and 25) and, on the other hand, the specific competition for Spanish startup projects within the framework of **Zinemaldia Startup Challenge**, the central initiative of the day Zinemaldia & Technology (September 26).

Within the framework of **Thought and Discussion**, the Industry Film Talks have dealt with the analysis of the success of Spanish crime series, the reflection on a more inclusive and diverse audiovisual, the contribution of generative artificial intelligence to the cinematographic field and the art of storytelling through iconic movie posters.

In its desire to be a space for training and professionalization, the Industry Department has continued to collaborate with agents of the Basque, Spanish and international audiovisual sector to offer professionals and filmmakers the opportunity to promote their projects. In addition to organizing, in collaboration with Europa Creativa MEDIA Desk Euskadi, consultancies for the internationalization of Basque projects, the **Pitching Korner** has been available to give visibility to projects and emerging talent through Tabakalera's project development programs: Noka Mentoring and Open Doors Locarno.

In addition, the **Meet Them!** initiative once again welcomed several delegations from France, Galicia, UK, Brazil, Dominican Republic, Taiwan, Andalusia, Colombia, Cantabria and Canada so that their professionals could get to know the Festival first hand, expand their network of contacts and participate in industry activities.

Finally, the **Lau Haizetara Documentary Co-Production Forum**, organized by EPE/IBAIA, held the twentieth edition of its usual pitching session before a panel of international commissioning editors.

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Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum



The San Telmo Museum hosts the one-to-one meetings between projects selected for the Co-Production Forum and industry professionals.

One to one meetings: 468 one to one meetings (543 in 2023) Forum's main objectives are to foster the development of audiovisual projects, encourage collaboration between professionals and promote an opening out towards new international markets.

Intended for fiction and non-fiction works in development, the Co-Production Forum is open to film projects from Europe and Latin America. The representatives of the projects can present their works through prerecorded pitchings and they receive a personal agenda of meetings with professionals interested in participating in their projects.

More than half of the films presented at the Forum have been completed and among the most recent successes, there are: *The Freshly Cut Grass*, by Celina Murga, winner for Best Screenplay at Tribeca Festival in 2024 and selected in Horizontes Latinos, and *Memorias de un cuerpo que arde / Memories of a Burning Body*, by Antonella Sudasassi Furniss winner of the Audience Award in the Panorama Section at Berlinale 2024. Horizontes Latinos also screened *Zafari* by Mariana Rondón, selected at the eighth edition of the Forum. Rondón won the Golden Shell with her film *Pelo Malo / Bad Hair* (2013).

Organised by the San Sebastian Festival, Tabakalera and EQZE, Ikusmira Berriak is a programme of residencies and project development designed to support and promote emerging talent and audiovisual creation.

The residency, running for eight weeks, involves a yearly programme split into two stages. The first stage takes place between March and April. For six weeks, the residents receive advice and work on the different stages of the development process. In September, coinciding with the Festival, they return for two weeks to work and foster potential collaborations with industry stakeholders who have access to the pre-recorded pitches in the Industria web section and can arrange one to one meetings.

Given the quality of the attending professionals and the context, time and resources made available to the filmmakers, Ikusmira Berriak has become one of the most and complete and ambitious residencies in the field of international filmmaking.

The programme, which celebrated its tenth anniversary in 2024 with a number of initiatives, has awakened strong interest in some of the most important festivals, proof of which is the premier of the following projects at the Festival and at others in the international circuit, such as Cannes, Locarno, Mar del Plata, Viennale, Visions du Reel or: *Trote*, by Xacio Baño (Ikusmira Berriak 2015); *Muga deitzen da*

Zinemaldia & Technology, activity organized in collaboration with TECNALIA, ALÍA (Alianza Industrial Audiovisual) and Vicomtech, represents a strategic commitment by the San Sebastian Festival, which aims to position itself as a reference space for reflection on the integration of new technologies to the audiovisual sector.

The session took place on Thursday, September 26, in the Prisma at Tabakalera-International Centre for Contemporary Culture and included the presentation of the Spanish and European projects selected for the sixth edition of the Zinemaldia Startup Challenge, followed by a talk about generative AI.

New this year, the industry accredited members had the opportunity to request meetings with the selected projects through the industry web section. The meetings took place on the afternoon of Thursday 26 at the Industry Club of the Kursaal Centre. Zinemaldia Startup Challenge is a competition promoted by the Basque Government, through the Department of Industry, Energetic Transition and Sustainability and SPRI. The Spanish competition is part of the Spanish Screenings: Financing & Tech initiative.

Proyecta - Ventana Sur (Montevideo, Uruguay)

Proyecta is a presentation of projects looking for international partners, co-producers and sales agents. This initiative, created in 2018 to promote co-productions in Latin America and with Europe, is organized jointly by Ventana Sur, Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes and San Sebastian Film Festival.

This initiative is intended for projects of feature films (fiction or non-fiction) in development in Europe and Latin America, that must be the director's first or second film and have 20% of its funding guaranteed. The European projects must also have a direct link with Latin America (involvement of a Latin American producer, shooting locations, actors in leading roles or subject matter in the script).

This year's selection represents a wide diversity of projects from Europe and Latin America. Nine of the selected projects are from Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Peru and Uruguay, while three are European, but with a strong connection with Latin America: two have Spanish production and one Swiss (*Malestar tropical / Tropical Malaise*, by Jorge Cadena, which participated in the last Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum at the San Sebastian Festival). In addition, five of the projects already have European co-production, specifically with France and Spain.

Proyecta is part of Ventana Sur, Latin America's biggest audiovisual market, organised jointly by the Instituto Nacional de Cine y Artes Audiovisuales de Argentina (INCAA), the Agencia del Cine y el Audiovisual del Uruguay (ACAU) and the Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes. The activity boasts the backing of Creative Europe MEDIA. The 2024 edition took place in Montevideo from 2-6 December in what was the 16th edition of Ventana Sur and the first held in the River Plate region hub.

Since 2015, through the Sebastiane Award, Gehitu (the Basque association of gays, lesbians, bisexuals, trans and intersexuals) and the San Sebastian Festival have joined forces to organise the **Meeting of Ibero-American LGTBIQA+ Festivals**, which runs on the same dates as the Industry activities and has an unequivocal vocation to provide a framework for reflection and networking.

In 2024, the event brought together 25 programmers from 22 festivals in Argentina, Colombia, Cuba, Guatemala, Mexico, Spain, Peru and Uruguay.

The Meeting has a double goal: on the one hand, to reflect on the trends and challenges facing the audiovisual sector in the field of LGTBIQA+ rights by means of round tables and the study of practical cases and, on the other, to open the Meeting to accredited industry delegates during the Festival. In addition, Gehitu gives two awards within the frame of the San Sebastian Festival: the Sebastiane Award going to the film presented at the Festival which best reflects the reality, freedom and social progress achieved by the LGTBIQA+ community; and the Sebastiane Latino Award going to a Latin American film of the year on the same subject.

On the 25th anniversary of the Sebastiane Award, a special screening of the film *120 battements par minute* / *120 beats per minute* was held on Sunday 22, with the presence of its director, Robin Campillo, and its lead actor, Nahuel Pérez Biscayart.

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Film Talks is a section of the San Sebastian Festival created to promote dialogue on film from an industrial, creative and educational perspective. Tabakalera (Room 1 and Z Room) is its main site, and it consists of different meetings that, during the nine days of the Festival, allow us to delve into the creative processes of filmmakers or discuss the trends and challenges of the film industry. It is also a space to discuss the impact of the main social debates on film and the responsibility of festivals in these issues.

Leos Carax (director): "I had a *déjà vu* experience when I was a kid, in an island. I opened the door and I thought 'OK, I've been here, I've seen this guy exactly that way, to the same light'. This is very powerful. And then I felt it again, when I was shooting my second film at one moment or two. This is really what I'm looking for, to find this feeling again. And it's hard to provoke it to you but, in a way, I think that's what cinema is. People who make cinema, they can't do anything: they can't make music, they can't draw, they can't write. I can't do anything. I think that's wonderful about cinema, it's like a virgin island where you can go if you have no gifts. And they give you all you can do, everything with nothing".

Antón Álvarez (director and musician): "Technology has enabled us to do so many things that the endless possibilities suck the life out of everything and give it a somewhat repugnant, dismal aspect... It's awful to hear a polished flamenco recording, with clapping in all the right places, or those videos shot on a set with meticulously composed images, perfect lighting... Limitations help you to do things that are more vibrant and more exciting".

Harto Rodríguez (musician): "I know I'm not doing anything new, but if I record a piano, I put a microphone on the floor to pick up the stomp of the feet, and I leave the door open so that you can hear the sound of a car in the distance. I find empty and ultraclean sound a little boring".

Yerai Cortés (musician): "I'm a person who comes from the purely gypsy, profoundly gypsy world, and who has gone on to arrive in a contemporary, modern world. I talk with music in my head: pure flamenco gypsy versus contemporary modern music.... It's very hard to label, to say who and what we are, but I'd like to remove the word 'problem' from the sentence 'I have an identity problem' and say: 'My search is ongoing".

Jane Schoenbrun (filmmaker): "The point of being trans is not purely identitarian, it's political. It's like saying, 'I believe that a world can be constructed in a different way', where like the boundaries of what is and isn't allowed can change. I feel constantly the assimilationist pressure in Hollywood. Especially for queer voices, it's like, make ourselves palatable and understandable to normative society. And that just feels like gentrification, and so I think it's like staying really true to that".

Behind the glamour: the actor facing of new recruitment paradigms

Sara Mora (lawyer): "Behind the glamour of the red carpet are many people who struggle to make a living. Acting is an enormously vocational job, you want to work, but it's hard to make enough to live on. In fact, almost everybody makes end meet by doing teaching or bar work".

Yolanda Serrano (casting director): "We work on very big productions and can say that there is no truth in the claim that influencers and YouTubers are taking jobs from professional actors".

Eva Leira (casting director): "It's unbelievable what artificial intelligence can do, it's scary, we're seeing mindblowing things, but I prefer to believe that it will never learn the ability to move people in the same way as a human being can".

María José Zulueta (agent): "As things currently stand, in actors' contracts the assignment of rights covers everything, meaning that the person signing it may be training any kind of artificial intelligence for the future. It's incredible".

Sean Baker (filmmaker): "Preaching? Why would I want to do that? If I'm preaching to an audience, I'm obviously preaching to people who already agree with me. And I find it quite boring... So, if I'm preaching, it's really just alienating everybody who doesn't agree with that ideology. And that's why if I'm going to have politics in my film, they have to be buried, they have to be subversive, they have to be open enough, so it allows audience members to even apply their own politics".

You can tell the mental and emotional wellness of a culture by how a government values the arts. And I feel it very strongly because art, storytelling and film and theatre saved my life over and over again".

John Crowley (filmmaker): "There is a line from a Lou Reed song, which is, he said, there's a bit of magic in everything and then some loss to even things out and that sort of polarity is in the film".

Nick Payne (filmmaker): "When I'm writing I'm not the kind of writer observing the characters as it were, I'm kind of in there with them, in the room. So, if they're having a great time, I'm sort of delighted. If they're not having a great time, I am kind of on my own weeping with them".

Production from a feminist and intersectional perspective

Lara Izagirre (director and producer): "My dream is to get up, work eight hours, film a sequence and go home: to make kilometre zero cinema. We are gradually building more feminist practices, and the situation is improving on film shoots. The idea is to make films and live, or to live making films, but without the sensation of having stopped living to make films".

Inés Nofuentes (producer): "We work with very small teams, endeavouring to construct more cooperative leaderships and relating with one another from another place, putting greater focus on empathy and caring, because at the end of the day, these are things that come through in the story we want to tell".

Beli Martínez (producer): "I favour a different way of making films. As a producer my obsession lies with what tales to choose, what stories to tell, what type of women to show... We need stories with greater diversity as otherwise we'll be generating a specific model".

Shani Dhanda (disability inclusion and accessibility specialist, social entrepreneur and broadcaster): "I want people with disability to be represented on screen: people having a coffee, loving one another, doing regular things... Having such a small stature and living with health problems seems to be the centre of my life when it's only a part of me, like having brown hair. Can you imagine a world where there was no representation of people with brown hair?"

Justin Edgar (director): "We must abandon negative narratives on disability. Stories often refer to the negative aspect but, for example, don't broach taboos such as love between people with disabilities who can even come to love their disability".

The true revolution will be how we do things from now on and how mindsets change; not whatever new technological invention may appear".

Elham Ehsas (director and screenwriter): "There are people who have to deal with the greater impact of climate change, and it is precisely those people who are marginalised in all areas of life, not only in the cinema. It is important to tell stories that lend a voice to people who are under-represented in society".

Nerea Ramírez Piris (coordinator of the Greenpeace ecofeminist movement): "One of the key elements for moving towards that change of paradigm is diversity. We need diverse approaches to the world, meaning that we need women... Diversity makes us stronger and more resilient and gives us new information that we would not otherwise have".

New Media: film and festivals in the age of social networks

Pepa Blanes (Head of Culture with the Cadena SER): "Some influencers make money for saying good things about a film and that is surreptitious advertising, a very serious matter. We are a something else, we review films, and we don't always say we like them. We can't try to become influencers, or they'll swallow us".

Diego Batlle (journalist and film critic): "I want to continue writing my reviews, it's what I love doing, but rejecting social media is overly pedantic. I would look ridiculous if, at my 55 years of age, I started to imitate a TikToker. But I can use tools and means of approaching other audiences without losing the identity I've built over the years".

Wendy Ide (Chief film critic of The Observer): "It's not at all healthy, but on social media you draw more attention with polarising content. People interact more with you when you exaggerate or hate, you get a bigger audience when you take a radical stance towards a film".

Series Conference: Spanish Horror Story. The success of Spanish crime series

Elías León Siminiani (producer, writer and director): "True crime comes with a strong marketing slant. The advent of platforms has enabled, among other things, investigation. With *El caso Asunta* we have the example of how platforms ask for twinned products: a fiction and a documentary".

Laura Sarmiento (creator and screenwriter): "In *El* cuerpo en llamas I was very afraid of the focus: it could either be a study of the characters or something enormously grotesque. But these are highly recognisable characters and that pushed me to write it. If it had been complete fiction, I would have been meaner towards one of the characters, but I wanted to protect the ambience".

Susana Herreras (producer): "*Querer* is not a true crime per se, but comes with many months of research. The focus is hyper-realistic, with respect to both the emotional and the legal aspects in order to build a case which, while not real, is true".

Sandra Tapia (Executive Producer at Arcadia Motion Pictures): "*As Bestas* was broadcast in its original language at prime time on Spanish Television with almost a million viewers. This is an example of how language and cultural policies must move in time with the industry".

Jérôme Vidal (Executive Producer at Noodles Production): "In our next film, we will have co-productions with countries such as Slovenia or Poland, coproductions which will enable the film to have distribution and access to a market".

Ignacio Amador Rodríguez (actor in *Reas*): "The audiovisual industry could be truly innovative if it were to select boys like myself without it necessarily being to play a part restricted to our trans identity. I like to think that there is hope of achieving something approaching a true change".

Charli Bujosa Cortés (producer): "I have to thank many labs and residencies because in the beginning it wasn't easy to access those spaces".

Afioco Gnecco (director and writer): "As trans men we feel that we haven't earned this space. We have been educated as women and don't dare to make them our own. When we win a competition or receive a grant we think that maybe they've given it to us because we're trans, to meet a quota".

Do Bofill (casting director): "As an actor you're faced with the stereotypes that decide what it is to be a trans man".

Zinemaldia & Technology: Does generative AI help us lead a better life?

Thursday 26, Prisma Tabakalera

Margarita Grubina (Vice-President of Business Growth at Respeecher): "There are three trends in AI (artificial intelligence) use. Firstly: there is more awareness of what AI is and about the responsible use that can be made of it. Secondly, its adoption: people have started to use it in their products and projects. And lastly, regulations: laws are being created to combat fraud due to the misuse of AI and in the future there will be even stricter rules".

Ignacio Lacosta (VFX Supervisor): "On the one hand, Al saves us a great deal of time but, on the other, we no longer need five people to work for three weeks on generating 100 models of, let's say, a cloud".

Judith Membrives i Llorens (Researcher and Cofounder of Algorights): "Al is neither artificial nor intelligent. It has material, social and ethical impacts. We can think of more crafted approaches, given the scarcity of environmental resources. We need public investment to create European infrastructures and not depend on others".

Jessica Sarah Rinland: 'Extramission: The Capture of Glowing Eyes'

17/09/2024-12/01/2025, Tabakalera-Exhibiton Room 2

The Tabakalera International Centre for Contemporary Culture, in collaboration with International Film Festival Rotterdam (IFFR) and the San Sebastian Festival, organized the exhibition *Extramission: The Capture of Glowing Eyes*, created by the Argentine-British filmmaker Jessica Sarah Rinland.

Jessica Sarah Rinland, who had a residency within the Ikusmira Berriak programme, also presented her latest feature film *Monólogo colectivo / Collective Monologue* at the San Sebastian Festival in the Zabaltegi-Tabakalera section, where it garnered a special mention.

One of the central features of the exhibition *Extramission: The Capture of Glowing Eyes* is the way in which Rinland combines early 20th century archival material from National Geographic magazine with new moving images and audio recordings. Rinland's audiovisual installation, curated by Tabakalera, includes two-channel video, each ten minutes long, which are projected in black and white with multi-track sound. The first screen was recorded at the Natural History Museum in London using thermal cameras, a technology originally employed in hunting and surveillance. These cameras capture the work of curators restoring stuffed animal specimens ready to be moved. In the video, the hands of the conservators, seen through the thermal camera, glow in contrast to the still, cold bodies of the animals, creating a visual metaphor for the relationship between humans and nature.

The second projection focuses on infrared images provided by the Rewilding Argentina foundation, which documents the process of reintroducing animal species into their natural habitats after having been kept in captivity in Europe.

Maximiliano Schonfeld: 'Sombra grande / Big Shadow'

20/09/2024-28/09/2024, Tabakalera-Floor 1

The San Sebastian Festival and Tabakalera organized the video installation *Sombra Grande / Big Shadow*, a work by the Argentinean filmmaker Maximiliano Schonfeld, which takes its inspiration from the universe of his feature-length film of the same name, and which had its world premiere in the Zabaltegi-Tabakalera section at the San Sebastian Festival's 72nd edition.

Schonfeld's movie is a non-fiction based on the rediscovery of a native language, Chaná, believed lost until recently and only spoken by one person in Argentina: Blas Jaime. In only a short time dictionaries were published and the language was completely recovered. That man situated the Chaná people in the same place where the descendants of the Volga Germans, in the Entre Ríos province, are today inexorably losing their dialect. That tension between two cultures coexisting in the same space provides the material for both the film and the video installation, dominated by the presence of Blas Jaime who, from the big centre screen, converses with the actors portraying the Chanás in the film. These people appear dotted over the space on several television screens emanating an expression, a rhythm and a soundscape that recreate a Chaná settlement from the scarce existing historical descriptions.

"The installation seeks to recreate sonically, for the first time, a hypothetical Chaná settlement in the province of Entre Ríos before the arrival of Sebastián Gaboto, sailor, cartographer and explorer of the 16th century. To do so, we turned to the few people who learned to speak this recovered language and we worked on the fauna of that time," explains Schonfeld.

On September 30 2000, Gehitu (the Basque association of gay, lesbian, bisexual, trans and intersex persons) gave the first Sebastiane Award going to the film best reflecting "the social reality of homosexuals" at the San Sebastian Festival. From *Krámpack* (Cesc Gay, 2000) to *20.000 especies de abejas / 20,000 Species of Bees* (Estibaliz Urresola, 2023), from the first to the last award, the prize, in keeping with the association itself, has extended the field of its recognition, following the realities, freedom and progress also made by trans, bisexual and intersexual persons, to encompass all those falling within the LGBTIQA+ collective.

The 25th anniversary of this pioneer award in Spain came with the special screening of the film *120 battements par minute / 120 Beats Per Minute*, winner of the Sebastiane Award in 2017, on Sunday 22 at the Príncipe Cinemas, attended by its director, Robin Campillo, and its leading actor, Nahuel Pérez Biscayart.

Audiovisual workshops: Gipuzkoa Coopera in Colombia and Argentina (March-October and March-December, 2024?)

Since 2017, the San Sebastian Festival has been collaborating with the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa in the development of the Gipuzkoa Coopera cooperation programme. The Festival organises audiovisual workshops in Latin American schools with students at risk of exclusion. Filmmaker lone Hernández, a member of the Festival's Selection Committee, directs the project and coordinates the directing and screenwriting workshops, as well as the team of professionals in the other disciplines: photography, sound, editing and art direction.

The on-site workshops took place in September at the Colegio Gran Colombiano in Bogotá (Colombia) and in October at the San Sebastián School of Education No. 37 in Mar del Plata (Argentina). In both centres. Teams of 40 students were formed in both schools and each made two complete short films from start to finish. In addition to the in-person workshops, online tutorials were held during the rest of the year to provide continuity and enrich the content of the project.

The workshops are funded by the San Sebastian Festival and the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa, which have donated the necessary equipment -cameras, lenses, lighting and sound kits, recorders, microphones...so that the students can create an audiovisual work autonomously.

Proyecciones: MASS (Spanish film season in Argentina and Uruguay) 28/11/2024-4/12/2024

The San Sebastian Festival, the Malaga Festival, and the Argentine production company Orca Films promoted MASS, a season of six films with Spanish production which were screened in Buenos Aires from 28-30 November and again from 2-4 December in Uruguay during Ventana Sur, Latin America's biggest audiovisual market. This activity, which enjoys the collaboration of Spain's Ministry of Culture through the Instituto de la Cinematografía y de las Artes Audiovisuales (ICAA), took place in the framework of support for internationalization of Spanish cinema and of the collaboration of both festivals with the Argentine industry. As well as the directors of the San Sebastian and Malaga festivals, a Spanish delegation travelled to Buenos Aires and Montevideo on behalf of the films. The San Sebastian Festival took two of the films from its Official Selection: Soy Nevenka / I Am Nevenka and Los destellos / Glimmers and Culinary Zinema's Mugaritz. Sin pan ni postre, the winning film of Culinary Zinema. For its part, the Malaga Festival presented Segundo premio / Saturn Return, Nina and La casa.

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Z365, a Festival all year round

A 365-day festival

For some time now, the San Sebastian Festival has made it clear that it is two things at the same time. On the one hand, it is a community celebration of the film world that takes place in San Sebastian, intensely, over nine days in September. An event at which said community and the general public discover films for the first time and where the film industry and the media meet to do business and exchange ideas and experiences.

On the other, it is an institution that works 365 days a year to foster training and the transmission of knowledge of film, to accompany the development of cinematic projects and to promote research and awareness. There is, therefore, the Festival as an event and the Festival as an institution. And Z365, or the Festival all year round, is what we identify as the Festival institution.

This activity lasting throughout the year is conducted thanks to location of the Festival offices in Tabakalera: a globally pioneer, innovative and unique project, housing an international centre for contemporary culture (the Tabakalera cultural project), an international film festival (the San Sebastian Festival), an international centre for thought, research, experimental practice and pedagogical innovation (Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola) and a national film archive (the Filmoteca Vasca). The building ecosystem therefore combines the past, present and future of the cinema, and it does so from a comprehensive point of view, supporting the community of filmmakers through projects that enjoy the participation of the different institutions which bring to the table their specific knowledge amassed while going about their professional work over the years.

The Z365 area encompasses several types of projects-Among the educational projects is the self-same Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola, a project shared since its conceptualisation and in which the Festival participates in very different ways: from sitting on the academic board to have a space of its own that seeks to make a theoretical-analytical-experiential approach to the reality of film festivals from a privileged place: the San Sebastian Festival as a point of departure and case study in a historical moment of paradigm shift. Así se busca dar respuesta colectiva, junto al profesorado, alumnado y profesionales presentes en la escuela, a la pregunta de qué ha sido, qué es y hacia dónde se dirige el Festival de San Sebastián. The second educational project, in collaboration with the Koldo Mitxelena Kulturunea, is Filmmakers' Dialogue, enabling participants to take a more unhurried look at the Basque and Spanish films of the year with their protagonists and narrowing the gap with the general public thanks to a training course.

Amongst the mixed programmes on training and the search for new talents is the **Nest** section, coorganised by the Festival and Tabakalera, and taking the shape of a competition for graduation projects by film students from all over the world. This section also has a strong training component thanks to the organisation of ad hoc master film talks with filmmakers, who share their creative processes.

The most important project development programme is **Ikusmira Berriak**, co-organised by the Festival, Tabakalera and the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola and which, with its tenth edition completed, is one of the international residencies programmes most highly considered by filmmakers thanks to the resources and advisory services it offers. To celebrate the tenth anniversary of Ikusmira Berriak, has launched during the year a series of 14 short video capsules created by the director Magdalena Orellana have been published on its new website. Like a film diary, these revolve around the memories and connections developed by filmmakers who have participated in the residency:

On the other hand, during the 72nd edition of the San Sebastian Festival, a meeting was organized that brought together more than 20 filmmakers who had passed through Ikusmira Berriak, and commemorative T-shirts were produced, designed by the illustrator Ander Pérez de Arenaza. Finally, ten persons who are part of the history of Ikusmira Berriak have been offered the chance to participate in a publication that will bring together voices, images and reflections on Ikusmira Berriak; this work will be published in the spring of 2025.

In the projects section are the Festival's collaboration with Tabakalera's mentoring programmes should also be mentioned. They were aimed at feature film projects by female directors living in the Basque Autonomous Community (**Noka**) and the series development lab (**2deo Serieak**).

This backing of emerging talent and accompaniment in the development of their projects seeks to weave an integral system of support for filmmaking talent: a system not limited to enabling a project to go ahead and gain visibility, but aiming to provide its moviemakers with training, accompaniment and backing that is lasting over time. The assistance in question starts in the classroom and continues until the films are shown, endeavouring not only to present new filmmakers, but to help them build a career and develop a professional life in the field of cinema. To this end **Kabia** was created in 2023, a day aimed at emerging talents so new filmmakers attending the San Sebastian Festival (delegations of New Directors and Nest, Ikusmira Berriak residents) and the community residing in the Tabakalera building (filmmakers selected for Noka, students at the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola film school...) could come together to exchange ideas and share projects. The idea is also to provide them with direct access to industry professionals (selected ad hoc for working in programmes that may interest the filmmakers and for their more educational aspect) who can give them valuable feedback on their professional career and their films projects.

Among the dissemination programmes is participation with the **Zinemaldia + Plus** spotlight on Tabakalera's shared screen, where the Festival programmes films and strategic projects corresponding to its lines of work throughout the year, as well as co-organisation and participation on the Editorial Board of **Zine**, the academic journal on Basque film studies.

Deserving special mention are two cross-cutting projects aiming to study the past and analyse the future of the San Sebastian Festival: <u>Artxiboa</u> (research into the event's living historical archive) and the <u>Thought</u> <u>and Discussion area</u>, whose goal is to analyse and anticipate the Festival's lines of action in the future.

January 2023 marked a new stage Festival's historical archive project: the **Artxiboa** website, offering access to four years of conservation, cataloguing and digitalisation work was a reality and, for the first time in its history, the space opened its doors for onsite consultation, with the assurance of full professional guarantees. Aiming to stimulate and enrich study and thought on the past of the event, Artxiboa launched the **José Ángel Herrero-Velarde research grants** has produced nine academic research projects in its two editions, providing new perspectives, knowledge and reflections on the history of the Festival. The grants are supported by the Department of Culture of the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa.

Thought and Discussion

Since its creation in 2020, the Thought and Discussion area has focused on the identification of relevant subjects, formats and experts to lead the discussion and formulate innovative responses around the main challenges and concerns facing contemporary film culture and the international festival circuit. In these four years, the area has focused on two issues: the transition towards a more sustainable event and work to incorporate the gender and diversity variables both to work processes and to the Festival contents.

The Thought and Discussion umbrella encompasses the Film Talks public area, a place to promote dialogue on the cinema from the industrial, creative and training points of view. Located in the Tabakalera (Room 1 and Room Z), the section consists of a series of round tables and master classes that, during the nine days of the festival, allow the to delve into the creative processes of filmmakers or discuss the trends and challenges of the film industry. It is also a space to discuss the impact of the main social debates on film and the responsibility of festivals in these issues.

Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola

Created and funded by the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa, the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola (EQZE) was born in 2017 with the spirit of stimulating the appearance of filmmakers taking a comprehensive approach to the cinema, capable of generating new filmmaking realities (labour-related, conceptual, creative, professional).

The San Sebastian Festival was a member of the work team that came up with the actual concept of the school together with the Basque Film Archive and the Tabakalera cultural project. The different areas of knowledge existing within the Tabakalera building were therefore encompassed in a unique academic proposal with three specialised subjects that would later become post-graduate degrees from the Public University of the Basque Country: Curating, Preservation and Filmmaking.

The participation of a film festival in the creation of a school represented, from the outset, a double thrust.

On the one hand, the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola would permit a slower speed, more academic, making it possible to analyse the past, present and future festivals in the context of festival studies. This reflection was responsible for the birth, for example, of the "*Z70: all possible stories*" project, which became Artxiboa in 2022.

On the other hand, participation in the School aimed to continue looking closely at projects which the Festival had previously set in motion and which reflected the mission of supporting and accompanying filmmakers on their road to entering the professional world, with sections such as Nest (the international film students' meeting), the Ikusmira Berriak project development residencies programme and New Directors, one of the Festival's most relevant sections, which selects the first and second films by their directors. The School came to fill this space to accompany the filmmakers in their transition from the classroom to the professional world.

Z365, a Festival all year round

Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola

Today the Festival is part of its academic management together with Tabakalera, the Basque Film Archive and the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa. It seeks a theoretical-analytical-experiential approach to the reality of film festivals from a privileged place: that of the San Sebastian Festival, as a starting point and case study in a historical moment of paradigm shift. The aim is to give a collective answer, together with the teachers, students and professionals present at the school, to the following question "What has the San Sebastian Festival been, what is it and where is it going?". Moreover, several of the Festival's professionals tutor specific projects by students of the Film Curating department and participate in committees to evaluate the students' final hypotheses.

Lastly, the Festival also sees itself as a space in which students from the school can participate and enjoy their first professional contact thanks to eleven paid internship positions in four of its departments: Communication, Web & IT, Industry, Technical, Training (Nest), Z365 (Thought and Discussion), Z365 (Archive).

Zinemaldia + Plus

The Festival created in 2020 Zinemaldia + Plus, the annual focus with which the event participates in Tabakalera's shared public screen. The focus places emphasis on how the event relates with film creation and the audiovisual industry, the territory and the community of which it is a part, something it does extensively in its calendar and format by programming screenings, round tables, conferences, dialogues with exhibitions, etc. Among other sessions Zinemaldia + Plus 2023 – 2024 hosted, among other sessions, the Festival's interactions with its 'Festival all year round' (Z365) programmes such as Artxiboa, strategic lines of Thought and Discussion such as genre and sustainability and the now traditional appointment with the filmography of the Donostia Awards.



Filmmakers' Dialogue



This programme aims to offer film buffs new keys to better understanding of the things we can't see behind the scenes of producing and making a film. *Filmmakers' Dialogues* take the shape of enjoyable discussions revealing the ins and outs of cinematic creation and all the talks follow the same the idea of the cinema as a collective profession. Each filmmaker will be accompanied by either one of their regular collaborators in different areas (editing, performing, screenwriting, production) or filmmakers with whom they share their generation, starting point or formal interests and subject matter. In addition to shifting the focus from the sole point of view of the moviemaker, the programme aims to explain the more traditional professions involved in developing a project, offering guidelines on how to take a critical approach to watching and understanding the cinema, in a context whose circumstances are causing it to mutate in every direction.




